Access

Following an initial assessment the individual has a personalised programme designed to meet their needs and interests. Attendance at access can be 1-5 days per week with the option to attend social activities and short breaks during the evening and weekends.

Day Opportunity Access supports the individual's progression towards their goal and aspirations. Support is provided to investigate existing skills, strengths and interests and develop these to enable participation in their chosen activities (either through work, learning or leisure).

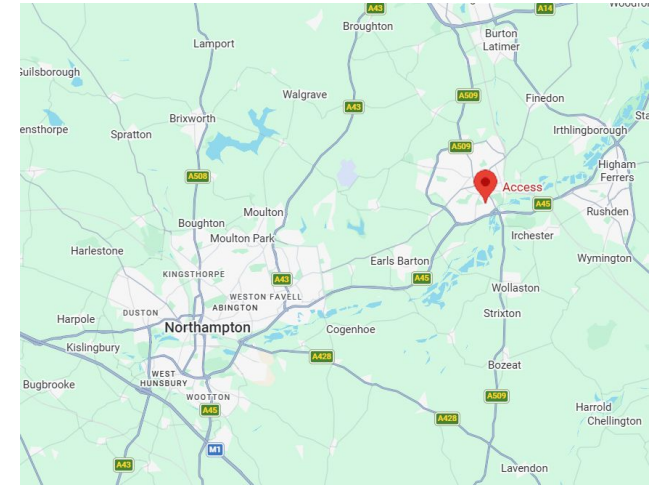
Leisure Via leisure we aim to develop individuals' independence to enable access and choice in leisure and recreational opportunities. Access supports the individual to discover their current interests and try new experiences with friends, in-house and in the community.

Examples of leisure activities include: bowling, cinema, dance, craft, eating out, special interests, friendships, games, park and pub visits, sports, swimming, snooker, theatre, walking, music and karaoke.

Work and learning Learning and developing skills to increase confidence, personal development and build and maintain friendships through enjoyable activities such as cooking, gardening, communication and social skills, travel, exercise and money skills.

Brookside Day Services

This centre for adults with learning difficulties is located right in the heart of Northampton's town centre. Brookside (BDS) provides opportunities for individuals to have an active choice in how they spend their time, enabling a sense of purpose and wellbeing. Brookside aim to provide activities that will meet the needs of the individual, moving away from the "one size fits all" approach and wholeheartedly embracing person centred practices.

Brookside cater for adults with a learning disability at their premises in Northampton's town centre. They have a modern environment with areas for activities, quiet reflection along with social spaces for communal times. The rooftop garden is used to grow organic fruit and vegetables which are used to prepare tasty lunches and snacks. This is tended by those who enjoy gardening. Lunch is included in cost.

At Brookside the team want all individuals to feel appreciated and for customers to have a sense of purpose and fulfilment. All activities will aim to: Build independence, create social experiences, develop friendships and positive relationships, enable life skills & grow confidence, support self-esteem and awareness, increase health and wellbeing and enable real work experiences

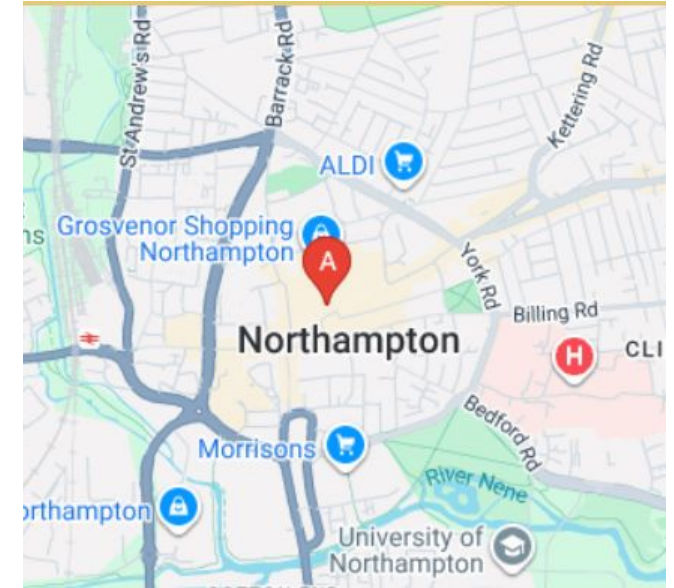
Please be aware the premises are situated on the second and third floor - with a fully accessible lift in operation but this may not be suitable for some clients.

Supported Internships, introduction courses, vocational pathways (catering, small animal care, retail, sports and leisure) -

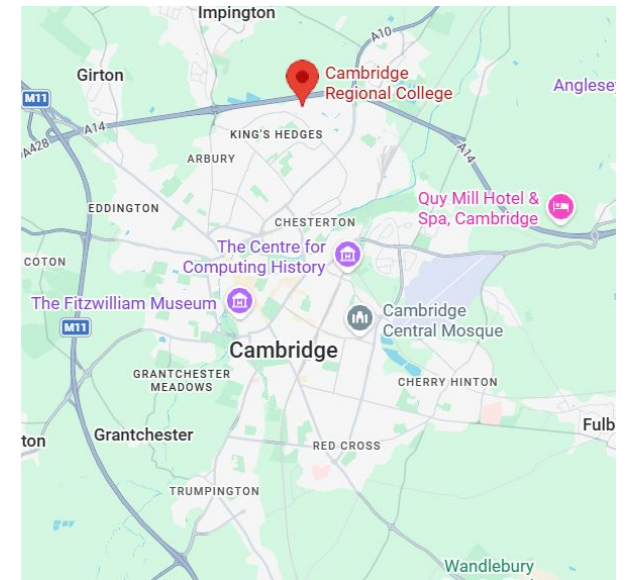
These courses are designed for students who are interested in gaining skills and careers in a particular industry but lack the required entry requirements to go onto a mainstream courses or apprenticeship programme. It is also ideal for students who need a more supported environment in which to learn and flourish and is an ideal move on from other E3 supported courses. These courses are the first step to gaining vocational qualifications that will help you decide what pathway to take further and has a clear goal to get you work ready by the end of the course.

Options - This is a level 1 employability course that helps to develop young people's personal and social skills and resilience for working life. The programme offers the chance to develop skills for life including home skills and cooking as well as enterprise skills through project based work. The highly supportive and small class sizes offers the opportunity to develop self-awareness and self-esteem.

Programmes of study include: Functional Skills (Pre-Entry to Level 1), Maths and English, Personal and social development, Vocational qualifications (subjects include music, drama, dance, art, small animal care, photography, sports, and cookery), Work experience. Supported internships are available for learners with a Education, Health and Care (EHC) Plan.

If you have special educational needs (SEN) and think you may require transport to and from college, contact the college directly for the college's transport information. Any eligibility for transport for those with special educational needs will be in accordance with West Northamptonshire Council's Post-16 Travel Policy.

Cafe Track

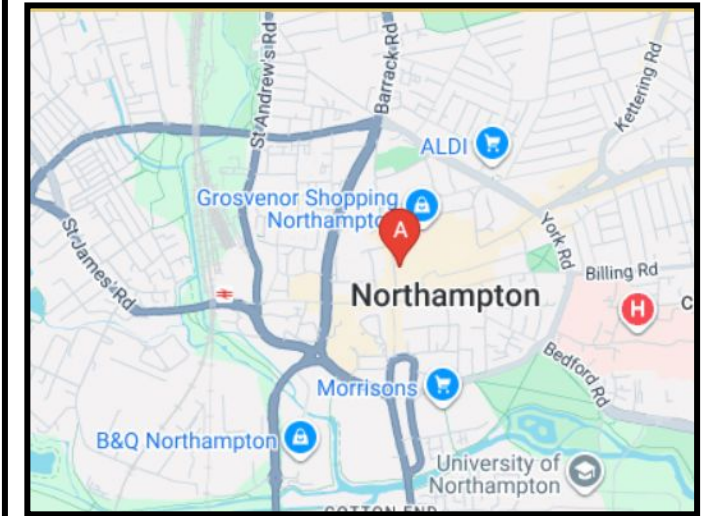
Track is a functioning Cafe in the town centre that supports autistic people to access employment, through training, support services and creating opportunities.

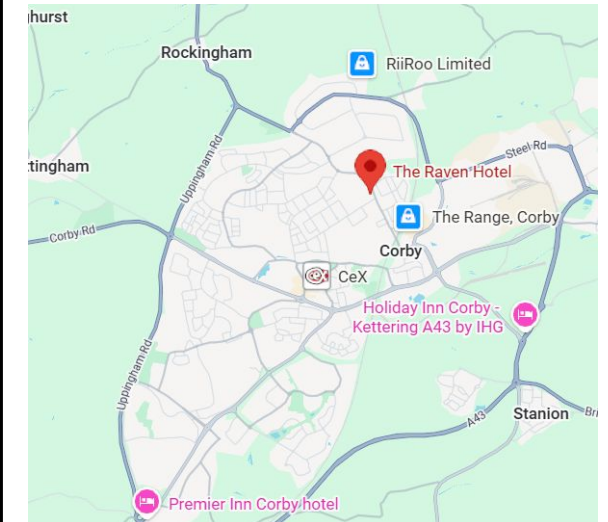

Creating Tomorrow College

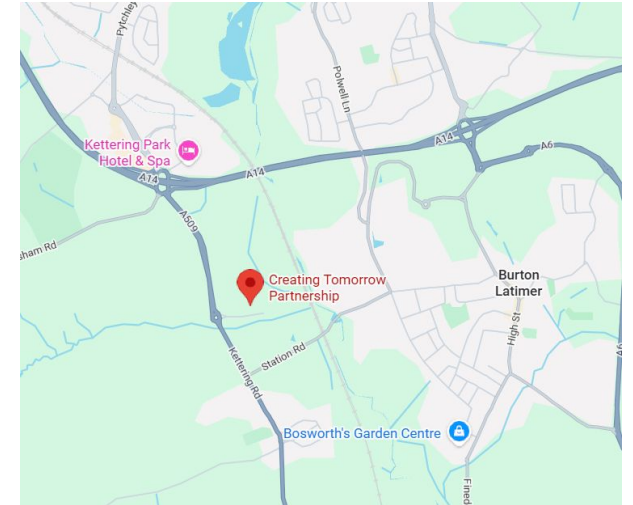

Fundays

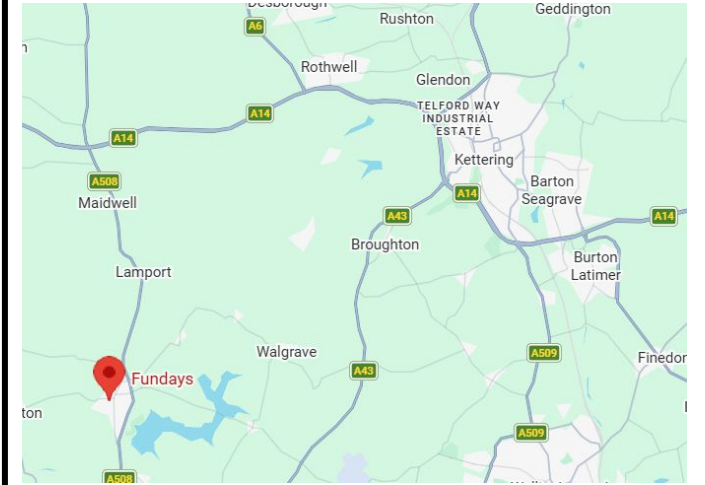
Fundays specialises in multi-sensory impairments and enhancing mobility skills within a small sensory environment. The provision caters for adults with learning disabilities and complex needs.

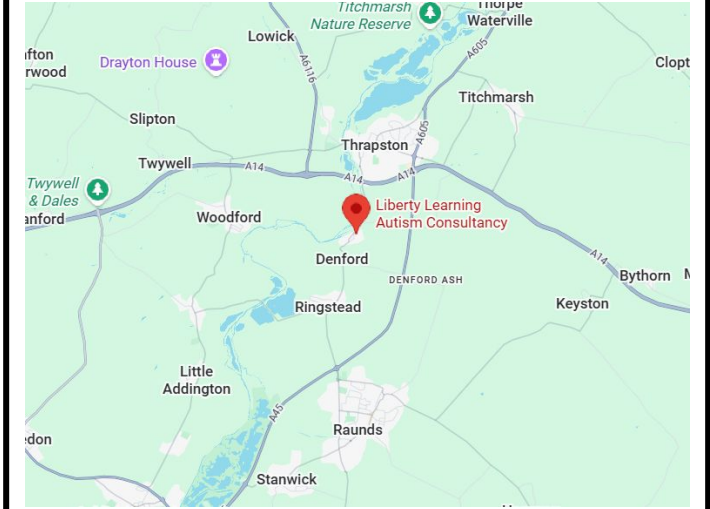
Liberty Learning

Lottie's Yard

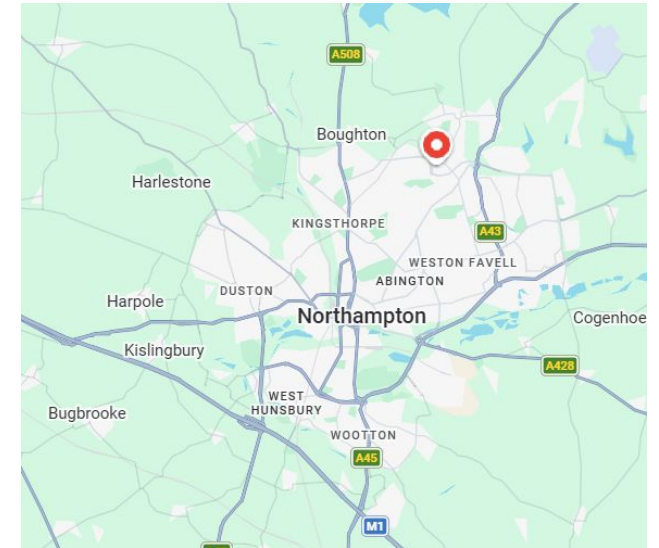
Lottie's Yard is a unique living and learning experience available to people with learning disabilities and/or autism in Northampton. The therapeutic effect of animals is becoming more recognised within the scientific field, especially amongst people with mental health and communication difficulties. Findings from our sessions have revealed that people arriving at a Lottie's Yard session will often leave with an observable sense of increased mental well being.

Our sessions run from our centre in Moulton Park called The Pod where we care for small animals and complete a learning program. We also have access to farms and yards across the county to visit and learn about larger animals. We try and vary the sessions so you can experience as much as possible!

With the assistance of small and large animals as well as the great outdoors, we support our customers to set outcome based goals, recognise undiscovered strengths, develop life skills, improve health and wellbeing, produce pride inducing art and crafts, socialise and make new friends and expand their knowledge on animals and outdoor living.

Courses are available at Entry Level 1 – Level 1. We offer courses in small animal care and horse care, gardening and floristry, cookery, farming and land-based skills which focus on practical skills. They also offers practical courses, essential skills and independence courses.

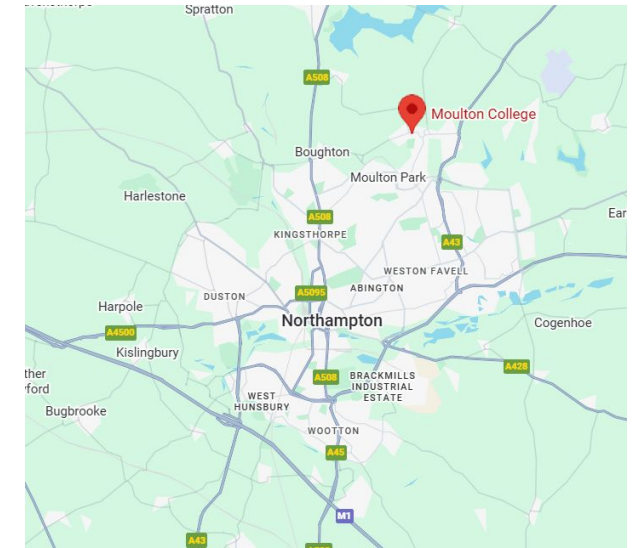
We offer support on a one to one basis and in small groups as well as in tutor group settings. The support available to you can cover theory and practical sessions. Within the Learning Resource Centre we have a Learning Support area where we provide popular drop in support sessions. All of our computers also have a range of assistive technologies installed on them, helping you to work independently; for example Text Reader software.

We are trained to support students with a variety of different additional needs including but not limited to:

- Dyslexia
- Dyscalculia
- Autism/Asperger's
- Mental Health Difficulties
- Emotional Behavioural Difficulties
- Hearing or sight impairments. We employ our own Communication Support Workers to work with deaf students and a number of our staff are able to use British Sign Language (BSL).

Mower's Ark

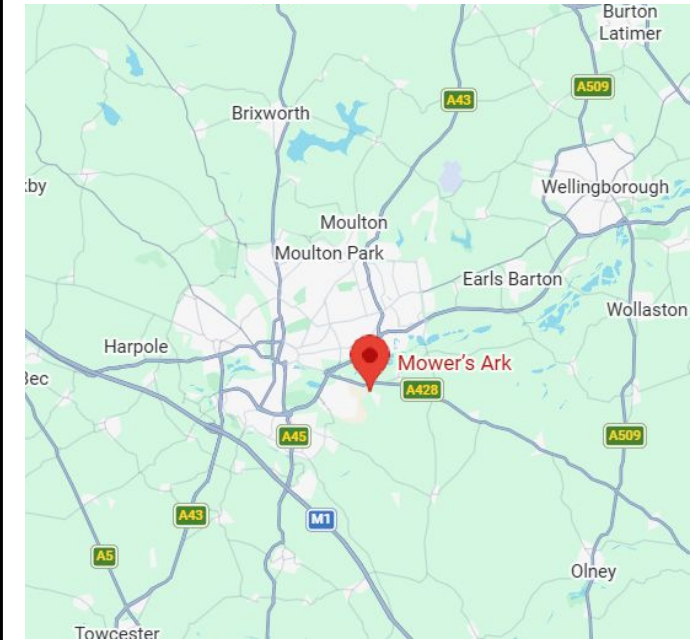

Mencap Supported Internships

Mencap Training Academy is a specialist post-16 provider delivering supported internships. Mencap's free supported internship programme delivers education and training to 16–24-year-olds with a learning disability who have an Education, Health, and Care (EHC) Plan. Mencap aims to effectively support more people with a learning disability to move into paid work.

Who Can Do a Supported Internship? To join a supported internship you need to: be aged 16 to 24, have an Education, Health, and Care (EHC) Plan, want to find a job. There are no qualification requirements.

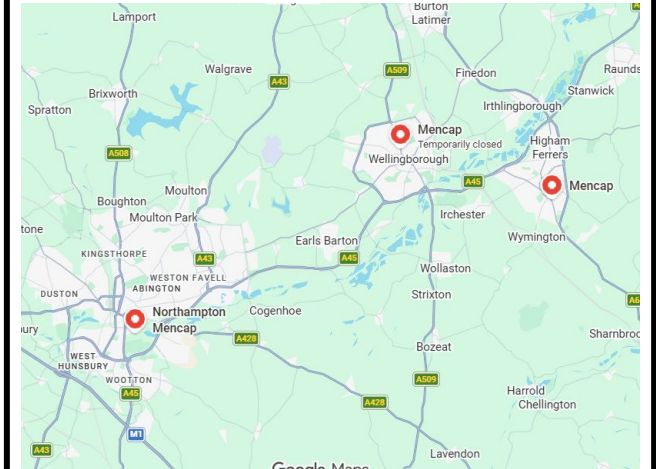
What Does a Supported Internship Involve? With a Mencap supported internship you will get to do work experience and complete classroom learning about the world of work and skills for the workplace. We also provide additional support for those who need it.

Work Experience - Most of the programme is work-based and you will be required to complete at least 420 hours of work experience. Mencap will find work experience placements for you that match your skills and interests. A Mencap caseworker and job coach will support you in the workplace, helping you to learn tasks and to get the most from your placement. **Classroom Learning** - Mencap's tutors run classes to develop your understanding of the world of work. You will learn about how to find and apply for jobs, and about the skills and behaviours you will need to succeed in the workplace.

Northamptonshire Supported Internships - In Northampton, there is the option to take a 2-year version of the supported internship where the first year would have a greater focus on classroom learning, with less work experience. 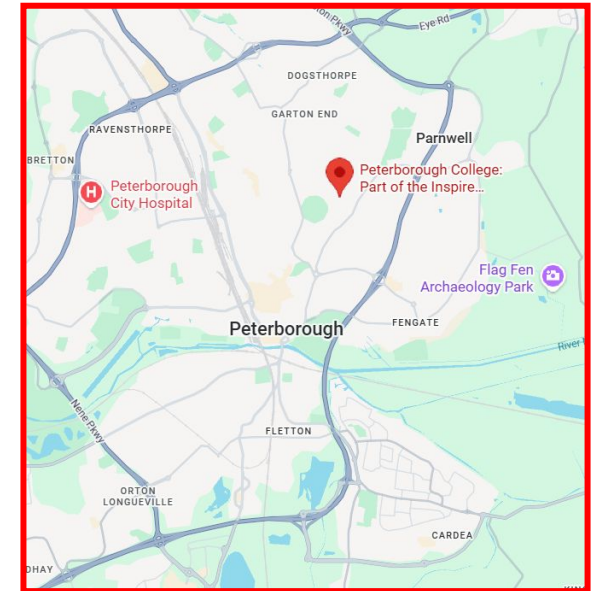

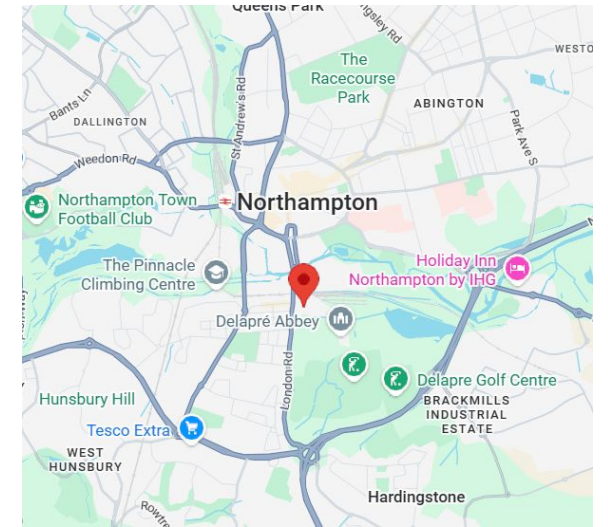

Courses

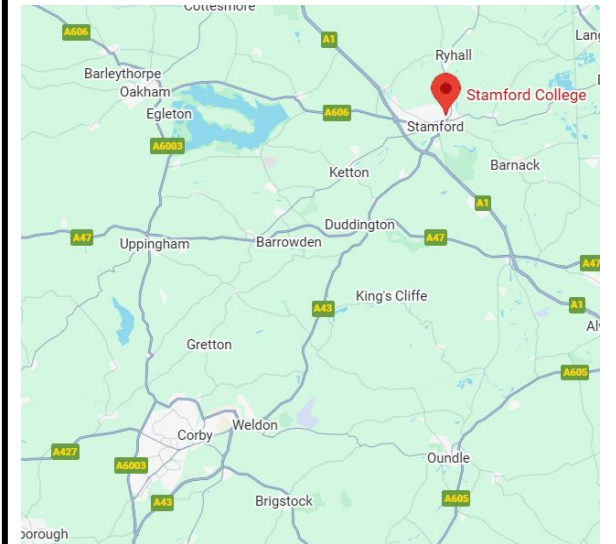
Towards Vocational Studies - This course serves as an introductory pathway for students who may need additional support to build skills and confidence to make the transition to further learning in the main college environment.

Personal Progress Entry Level 1 - An entry level course with an emphasis on social, independence, practical and sensory activities. Develop independence, social and emotional skills whilst learning about personal presentation, good health, household skills, independent living, mobility, citizenship, money handling, budgeting, employability, developing friendships, leisure and enrichment activities. Learners will be in small sized groups with others working at a similar level.

Exploring Animals, Horticulture and Life Skills Entry Level 2 and 3 - aimed at those students who require additional support, for example with social skills, building confidence and independence, developing study skills and insights into the Animal and Horticulture industry, before moving on to the next step in their journey. Students will gain specific and transferable work skills whilst exploring careers in the land-based industry and offers the opportunity to experience working with animals in a horticulture environment. Students will also undertake work experience in real working animal care and horticulture environments.

- **Employability:** Students get work experience and learn job skills. This helps them prepare for work.

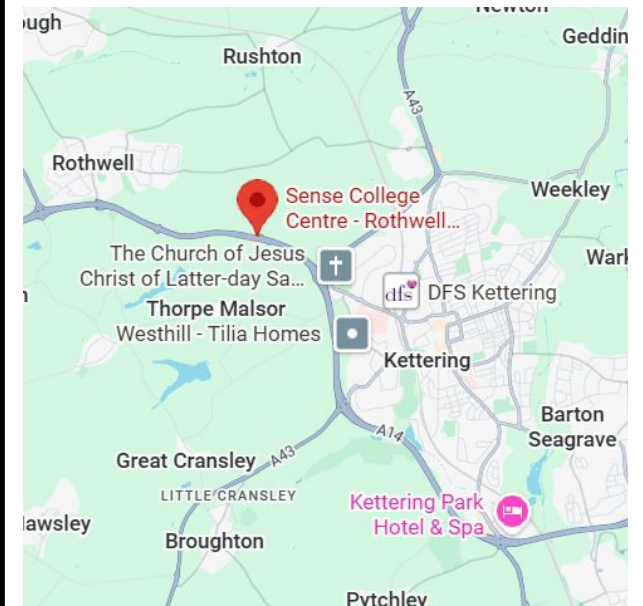

Smile is an inspirational day centre that provides high quality care for adults with learning difficulties. We are a caring service that promotes diversity, independence and choice.

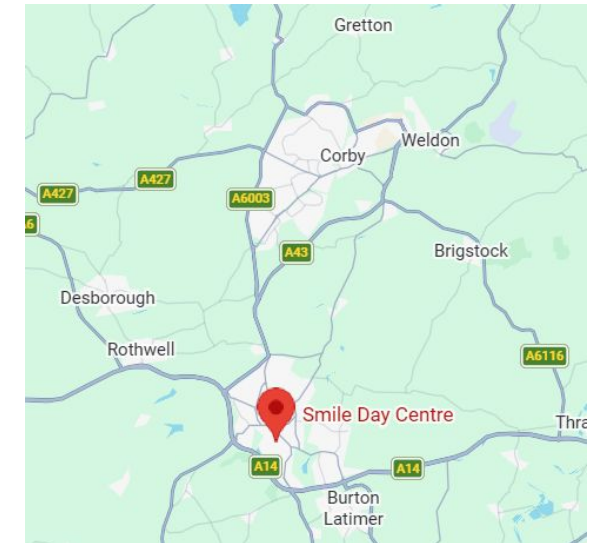

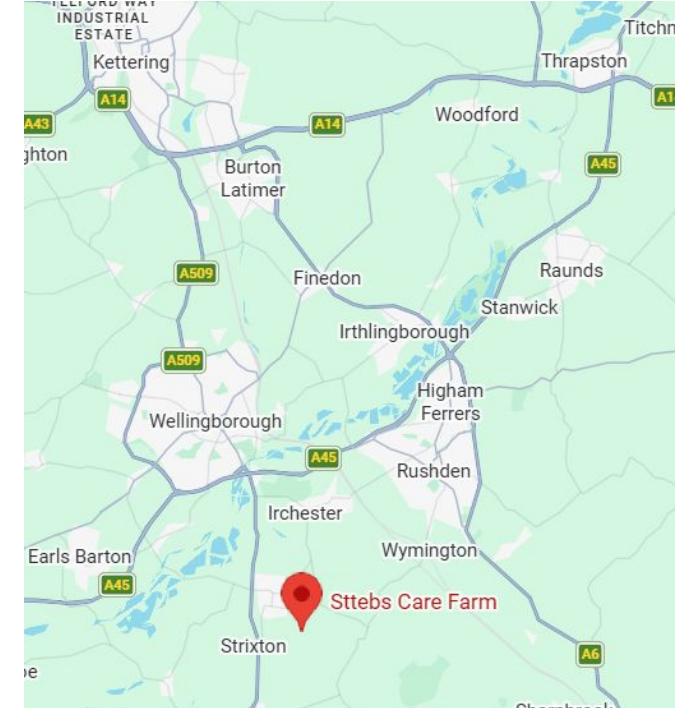
Regular activities include animal care, maintaining a wildlife and sensory garden, learning where food comes from, and growing fruit and vegetables.

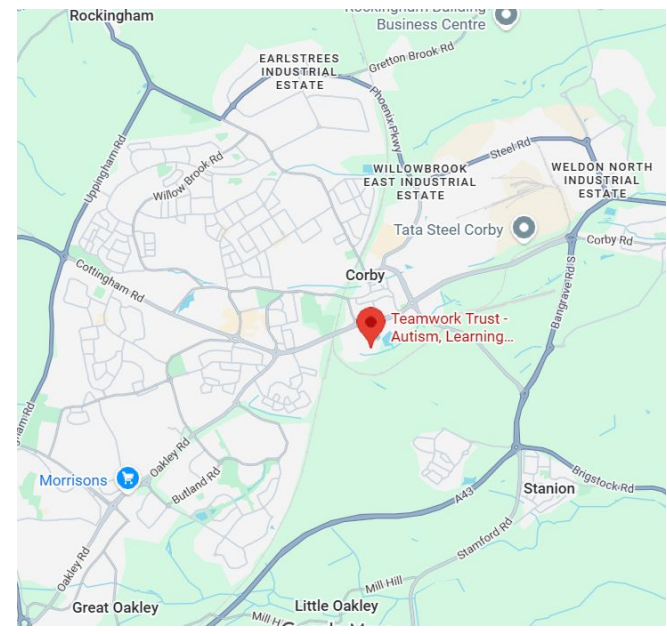

Initially a one-year course, individuals may progress within the department or on to other college-based programmes.

The Place to Bee

The Place to Bee is a brand-new venture based in Kingsthorpe. It is part of Northgate School Arts College and The Bee Hive. It offers young adults (aged 19-25) with learning disabilities the opportunities to follow a vocational pathway into customer service and retail. Service-users are mentored by job coaches and a small team of staff.

Independence, teamwork, knowledge, and self-esteem are developed through hands-on learning and mentoring within a café, sweetshop, and life-skills flat. The Place to Bee aims to develop skills to prepare service-users for the world of work and employability. The café is dog-friendly and has an outside seating area.

All the activities carried out within The Place to Bee are essential to running a fully functional business. Service-users are an integral part of the team, and staff encourage everyone to reach their full potential.

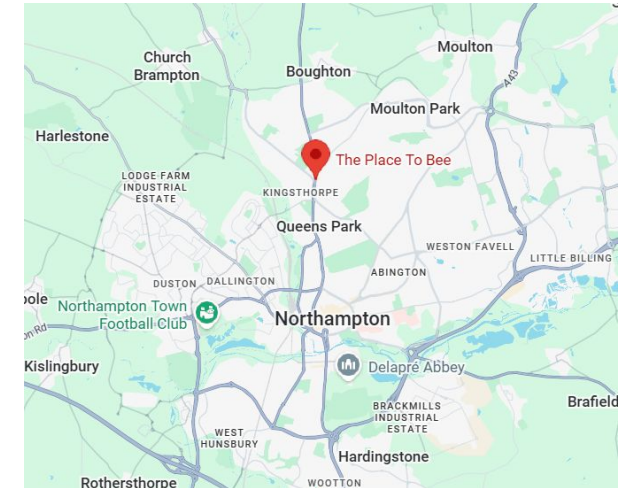

WiEducate

WiEducate is an education provision for young people aged 16+ with an EHCP. They offer bespoke programmes to support young people back into education, training or employment.

WiEducate works with young people who have been unable to attend other education provision. They deliver an outreach programme and a group programme.

The group programme works with a small group of young people (up to 5) supporting them to build on their skills within the community, life skills and transition into their next steps. WiEducate supports young people to gain their Functional skills in English and Maths as well as develop skills to support them into adulthood such as budgeting, cooking, accessing the community, travelling and keeping safe.
